

How "Rich Memories" was Created

Recall a memory and select a photo

In about 1948 three photos were taken of two brothers. The pictures were taken because their matching yellow sweater vests were hand knitted by their mother.

For the drawing, the client chose the image with the car. The car had memories of its own. Plus, it added a little something special. And the yellow sweaters would really stand out against the black car. The other two pictures were still used for added details such as facial features.




Develop a mock up



A Photoshop "mock-up" was created to help visualize the finished image. The image was cropped to focus on the car and the boys. The discoloration of the photo was altered back to the original black and white. Because the photo was slightly damaged from age and wear, minor corrections were made. Cars and extraneous details were removed and yellow was added to the sweater vests.

Research and reconstruct lost details

Detail from a photo taken 70 years ago hardly compares to today's high-res images. Add to that fading ink and parts of some pictures have disappeared. The car model and even the license plates were researched to add back in details. In the original photo, the legs of the boy on the right have nearly disappeared but with a few visible hints they were reconstructed as can be seen in the in-progress photo. All of the research contributes to the art as it progresses.
